#### Holy Cross Lutheran FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST June 28, 2020

AS WE GATHER Today, we continue our sermon series with the first part of Romans chapter seven and tie in from last week's sixth chapter, of not neglecting the gift of grace in baptism through Christ's death for us (His burying our "sin" or "bad bones,"). In this same thought this week, the law shows us the gravity of sin and its destruction and inability to save us. Though, it cannot save, Paul yet says the law is not thrown away or discounted but is held in honor to magnify Christ and His gift of salvation. It is the Gospel that keeps sanctifying our lives in the grace of God, daily, hourly, moment by moment as the law keeps showing us our sin in this life and the Gospel, Christ's ongoing sanctification until He comes for us! Paul tells us how to live until we are called home to heaven. He mentions in our text today, "that we serve in the new way of the Spirit." The Spirit is the one who opens our heart to face the hard truth of our selfishness and idolatry, and then completes our faith with love pointing to Jesus! God sent Jesus for You! Jesus came for you! The act of Jesus, paying in full our debt of sin, is the most powerful gift or you might say miracle of all. Forgiveness is love! Paul does not want this gift/miracle to elude you or anyone. It is a miracle of forgiveness shared between parents and children, husbands and wives, brothers, and sisters, for neighbors, for strangers, for those even at war. As it says in our Psalm today, this is the covenant that was planned before the world existed for ever generation; the promise of Jesus given in grace believed by the Spirit's gift of faith! We sing with the psalmist the Messianic promise, "I will sing of the steadfast love of Yahweh, forever with my mouth I will make known your faithfulness to all generations.!" (Psalm 89:1). Jesus is steadfast love! God bless your worship today

# **OLD TESTAMENT READING**

Jeremiah 28:5-9

(Jeremiah condemns Hananiah for preaching peace while God has exiled most of the people to Babylon.)

L: <sup>5</sup>Then the prophet Jeremiah spoke to Hananiah the prophet in the presence of the priests and all the people who were standing in the house of the LORD, <sup>6</sup>and the prophet Jeremiah said, "Amen! May the LORD do so; may the LORD make the words that you have prophesied come true, and bring back to this place from Babylon the vessels of the house of the LORD, and all the exiles. <sup>7</sup>Yet hear now this word that I speak in your hearing and in the hearing of all the people. <sup>8</sup>The prophets who preceded you and me from ancient times prophesied war, famine, and pestilence against many countries and great kingdoms. <sup>9</sup>As for the prophet who prophesies peace, when the word of that prophet comes to pass, then it will be known that the LORD has truly sent the prophet."

L: This is the Word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

(The purpose of the Law is to show the gravity and depth of our sin and need for a Savior to set us free in death; but not ours, His!)

L: <sup>1</sup>Or do you not know, brothers—for I am speaking to those who know the law—that the law is binding on a person only as long as he lives? <sup>2</sup>Thus a married woman is bound by law to her husband while he lives, but if her husband dies she is released from the law of marriage. <sup>3</sup>Accordingly, she will be called an adulteress if she lives with another man while her husband is alive. But if her husband dies, she is free from that law, and if she marries another man she is not an adulteress.<sup>4</sup>Likewise, my brothers, you also have died to the law through the body of Christ, so that you may belong to another, to him who has been raised from the dead, in order that we may bear fruit for God. <sup>5</sup>For while we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the law, were at work in our members to bear fruit for death. <sup>6</sup>But now we are released from the law, having died to that which held us captive, so that we serve not under the old written code but in the new life of the Spirit.<sup>7</sup>What then shall we say? That the law is sin? By no means! Yet if it had not been for the law, I would not have known sin. I would not have known what it is to covet if the law had not said, "You shall not covet." <sup>8</sup>But sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, produced in me all kinds of covetousness. Apart from the law, sin lies dead. <sup>9</sup>I was once alive apart from the law, but when the commandment came, sin came alive and I died. <sup>10</sup>The very commandment that promised life proved to be death to me. <sup>11</sup>For sin, seizing an opportunity through the commandment, deceived me and through it killed me. <sup>12</sup>So the law is holy, and the commandment is holy and righteous and good.<sup>13</sup>Did that which is good, then, bring death to me? By no means! It was sin, producing death in me through what is good, in order that sin might be shown to be sin, and through the commandment might become sinful beyond measure.

L: This is the Word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

#### **HOLY GOSPEL**

Matthew 10:34-42

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the tenth chapter

C: Glory to You, O Lord.

(Jesus declares that following Him must take precedence over every relationship.)

P: <sup>34</sup>[Jesus said:] "Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. <sup>35</sup>For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law. <sup>36</sup>And a person's enemies will be those of his own household. <sup>37</sup>Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. <sup>38</sup>And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me.

<sup>39</sup>Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. <sup>40</sup>"Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives him who sent me. <sup>41</sup>The one who receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and the one who receives a righteous person because he is a righteous person will receive a righteous person's reward. <sup>42</sup>And whoever gives one of these little ones even a cup of cold water because he is a disciple, truly, I say to you, he will by no means lose his reward."

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord. C: Praise to You, O Christ.
