


AS WE GATHER - Before Jesus was arrested in the garden of Gethsemane, He prays for the disciples that they may be One as He and the Father are One and prays for the Spirit to fill them to be One with them. In our sermon series on Romans, Paul also speaks about the importance of the church being One and that Jew and Gentile, either one, need to be careful of setting themselves apart with their own view of who they are in their life with God. Paul begins to move from his discourse of justification in his letter to the Romans transitioning to sanctification and practice in how we live with one another with Christ in peace and not pride from our old way of doing things or differences in culture. At the end of this part of Paul's letter he shares an analogy of branches being grafted into the root or core of the tree; Christ is that root, that core, the way for all the world to be saved and grafted in or re-grafted into His grace, to be one people of God, to be His children. The Lord bless you as we rejoice together in being part of one faith, one hope, one baptism in one Lord Jesus Christ who saves us from all unrighteousness.

EPISTLE

Romans 11:1-2, 13-15, 28-32

(God will have mercy on both Jew and Gentile.)

¹I ask, then, has God rejected his people? By no means! For I myself am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, a member of the tribe of Benjamin. ²God has not rejected his people whom he foreknew. Do you not know what the Scripture says of Elijah, how he appeals to God against Israel?... ¹³Now I am speaking to you Gentiles. Inasmuch then as I am an apostle to the Gentiles, I magnify my ministry ¹⁴in order somehow to make my fellow Jews jealous, and thus save some of them. ¹⁵For if their rejection means the reconciliation of the world, what will their acceptance mean but life from the dead?... ²⁸As regards the gospel, they are enemies of God for your sake. But as regards election,

Isaiah 56:1, 6-8

they are beloved for the sake of their forefathers. ²⁹For the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable. ³⁰Just as you were at one time disobedient to God but now have received mercy because of their disobedience, ³¹Iso they too have now been disobedient in order that by the mercy shown to you they also may now receive mercy. ³²For God has consigned all to disobedience, that he may have mercy on all.

(Jesus heals the daughter of a beseeching woman.)


²¹ Jesus went away from there and withdrew to the district of Tyre and Sidon. ²²And behold, a Canaanite woman from that region came out and was crying, "Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David; my daughter is severely oppressed by a demon." ²³But he did not answer her a word. And his disciples came and begged him, saying, "Send her away, for she is crying out after us." ²⁴He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." ²⁵But she came and knelt before him, saying, "Lord, help me." ²⁶And he answered, "It is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." ²⁷She said, "Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table." ²⁸Then Jesus answered her, "O woman, great is your faith! Be it done for you as you desire." And her daughter was healed instantly.

THE PREPARATION (please take your communion vessel in hand for our Lord's Words of Institution)

THE WORDS OF OUR LORD P: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and after giving thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My **†** body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also after supper, He took the cup, and after giving thanks He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this is My **†** blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of all your sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."
