


Advent Devotions from Lutheran Hour Ministries God with Us



"LASSIE"

<u>L</u>isten, <u>A</u>sk, <u>S</u>eek, <u>S</u>hare, <u>I</u>nvite, <u>E</u>ncourage

The vital communication needs in relationships follow this communication model called **LASSIE**. **Listen** to the need of the person. **Ask** open ended questions to learn more about their need. **Seek** what is behind the need (a loss, or change in life, a hurt, etc...

Share what you finally hear being said by them so to connect the dots of the real need or theme of emptiness/aloneness. **Invite**, the person to pray with them, and offer any resources you may have including online resources to walk beside them.

Encourage, communicate that they are not alone; the Lord is there and is giving you strength to help them. Call, email, text and pray for them during the time of difficulty. Share church resources that the LCMS has or will develop soon and participate with them in the resources.

As we prepare for the celebrations of Thanksgiving, may we all give thanks continually for all that we are and all that we have because of God's providential care.
