HOLY CROSS CHRISTMAS EVE - THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD

Christmas Worship and Communion

AS WE GATHER Preparing our Heart for Christmas this year, during the midweek Advent series, we have looked at the genealogy of Jesus, which Matthew records at the beginning of his Gospel. We have learned the following from Jesus' titles: the **Son of David** ushers in an eternal Kingdom for us, the **Son of Abraham** came that we might inherit the heavenly promised land, the **Son of scandal** graciously invites sinners to His family by Baptism, and the **Son of Joseph** remembers the forgotten people of the world but forgives and forgets



their sins. This evening, we consider the last name in the list, Mary. A young girl, a virgin, from the Galilean hills will be the young mother of our Lord. Through this hand maiden of the Lord, God becomes truly human. This child will be the **Son of God**, as the Holy Spirit begets a miracle of life that the human and divine are one in Jesus although, the humble Christ has poured himself out, not considering God something to be grasped; but made himself nothing with all aspects to being fully human and thus being able to suffer and to know great pain as the **Son of Man**. Jesus is completely fully human an exact match for substituting His life for ours, though not broken by sin, yet dealing with all the sin for all of humanity - even dealing with the short comings of Mary His Mother. God showed us His love by sending His Son to be born of Mary, **Son of Mary**, and to exchange His life for ours. He came to save us all. O come, let us adore Him, Christ the Lord, our newborn Savior and King.

- P: And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,
- C: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom He is pleased!"
- P: When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another,
- C: "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us."
- P: And they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in a manger. And when they saw it, they made known the saying that had been told them concerning this child. And all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured up all these things, pondering them in her heart.
- C: And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

POST-COMMUNION PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING


P: Let us pray together: We give thanks to You, almighty God, that Your real presence has come to us through the bread and wine to gladden our heart. You came as true man born for us this
