


- P: Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven; whose sin is covered.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Jeremiah 31:1-13, 23-25, 31-33 (NIV)

(The Lord brings back His people from Captivity that they might rejoice again in His love)

L: 1"At that time," declares the LORD, "I will be the God of all the families of Israel, and they will be my people." ² This is what the LORD says: "The people who survive the sword will find favor in the wilderness; I will come to give rest to Israel." ³ The LORD appeared to us in the past, saying: "I have loved you with an everlasting love; I have drawn you with unfailing kindness. ⁴ I will build you up again, and you, Virgin Israel, will be rebuilt. Again, you will take up your timbrels and go out to dance with the joyful. ⁵ Again, you will plant vineyards on the hills of Samaria; the farmers will plant them and enjoy their fruit. ⁶ There will be a day when watchmen cry out on the hills of Ephraim, 'Come, let us go up to Zion, to the LORD our God.'" ⁷ This is what the LORD says: "Sing with joy for Jacob; shout for the foremost of the nations. Make your praises heard, and say, 'LORD, save your people, the remnant of Israel.' ⁸ See, I will bring them from the land of the north and gather them from the ends of the earth. Among them will be the blind and the lame, expectant mothers and women in labor; a great throng will return. ⁹ They will come with weeping; they will pray as I bring them back. I will lead them beside streams of water on a

level path where they will not stumble, because I am Israel's father, and Ephraim is my firstborn son. 10 "Hear the word of the LORD, you nations, proclaim it in distant coastlands: 'He who scattered Israel will gather them and will watch over his flock like a shepherd.' 11 For the LORD will deliver Jacob and redeem them from the hand of those stronger than they. ¹² They will come and shout for joy on the heights of Zion; they will rejoice in the bounty of the LORD— the grain, the new wine, and the olive oil, the young of the flocks and herds. They will be like a well-watered garden, and they will sorrow no more. ¹³Then young women will dance and be glad, young men and old as well. I will turn their mourning into gladness; I will give them comfort and joy instead of sorrow. ²³This is what the LORD Almighty, the God of Israel, says: "When I bring them back from captivity, the people in the land of Judah and in its towns will once again use these words: 'The LORD bless you, you prosperous city, you sacred mountain.' ²⁴People will live together in Judah and all its towns—farmers and those who move about with their flocks. ²⁵ I will refresh the weary and satisfy the faint." ³¹ "The days are coming," declares the LORD, "when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and with the people of Judah. 32 It will not be like the covenant I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to them," declares the LORD. 33 "This is the covenant I will make with the people of Israel after that time," declares the LORD. "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people.

Alleluia. For God did not His Son into the world to condemn the world but to save it. Alleluia.


HOLY GOSPEL John 3:1-17 (ESV)

(Nicodemus learns about God's grace in Christ)

¹Now there was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. ²This man came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher come from God, for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." ³Jesus answered him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." ⁴Nicodemus said to him, "How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" ⁵Jesus answered, "Truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. ⁶That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' ⁸The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So, it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." ⁹Nicodemus said to him, "How can these things be?" ¹⁰Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things? 11Truly, truly, I say to you, we speak of what we know, and bear witness to what we have seen, but you do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe how can you believe if I tell you heavenly things? ¹³No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. ¹⁶[Jesus said:] "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

Pastor and Janean visit on Wednesday however, currently because of Covid restrictions they are the only ones to visit on Wednesdays.

JANUARY 31, VOTERS' MEETING: Next week the Holy Cross Voter's meeting will include a special vote, at the request of the President of the LCMS, Rev. Matthew Harrison, to suspend the National LCMS Convention one year, moving it from the summer of 2022 to the summer of 2023 due to Covid-19 complications and state restrictions that are causing District conventions to be delayed this 2021 year. The Synod by-laws specify that for Congregations to vote at the Synod's Convention, District Conventions need to be held the previous year of the National Convention to meet the voting by-law requirement. Thus, the delay for the National Convention is to help all Congregations/Districts be equally represented at the National Convention. **Note:** President Harrison also wanted to share that there will be some costs to reschedule Synod's Convention, but Synod will do their best to be good stewards of the church's finances. President Harrison has stated this is an unprecedented time with the pandemic and assures the Synod that there is not any particular theological position that would question this request. Last but not least, in order that the voting goes smooth and only need to happen once, another by-law must be met. A minimum of 25% of Synod's congregations must vote and submit the vote before Feb 15, 2021. Approximately, 1,550 congregations need to vote in the next 2-3 weeks out of about 6,200 congregations. Thank you for your willingness as a congregation to walk together as brothers and sisters in Christ with Synod's request and with our sister congregations across the country.

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated today. Our belief and practice is Confessional. Jesus clearly teaches He is truly present in His supper in the bread and wine. We receive miraculously, in the gift of faith, His true body and blood, given and shed for the forgiveness of sins. If this is your confession and you have been baptized and confirmed in our church body, please commune with us.
