AS WE GATHER One of the marks of great missionaries is that, like God, they show no partiality among persons (Acts 10:34). Today, in our first reading, the Lord guides Peter to show no partiality in sharing the Gospel to the Gentiles, through a vision of clean and unclean food. Though at first, Peter resisted what the Lord was wanting Him to do when commanded by God in the vision to eat unclean food the Lord had provided. But soon Peter sees the Lord's hand that all nations and peoples no matter their past, the Lord wants His saving grace to be proclaimed to all. The Lord also has and will show us, even with our resistance sometimes, to follow His guidance in sharing His promises of grace to our community. His Living Word guides our lives daily. In our Gospel lesson, Jesus reminds the disciples that only by remaining in Him will they bear much fruit. It is only through His Holy Spirit that His will is accomplished living by His grace each moment of life through His love. The Lord bless you as we grow in discipleship through the hearing of His Good News that we show no partiality in loving others in Christ.

FIRST READING

Acts 10:34-48

(People from every nation are accepted by God.)

³⁴So Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (he is Lord of all), ³⁷you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, ⁴⁰but God raised him on the third day and made him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴²And he commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name." 44While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word. ⁴⁵And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on the Gentiles. ⁴⁶For they were hearing them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter declared, ⁴⁷"Can anyone withhold water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" ⁴⁸And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked him to remain for some days.

L: This is the Word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

EPISTLE 1 John 5:1-8

(The victory of Christ overcomes the world.)

¹Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the Father loves whoever has been born of him. ²By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. ³For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome. ⁴For everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith. ⁵Who is it that overcomes the world except the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? ⁶This is he who came by water and blood—Jesus Christ; not by the water only but by the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one who testifies, because the Spirit is the truth. ⁷For there are three that testify: ⁸the Spirit and the water and the blood; and these three agree.

L: This is the Word of the Lord. C: Thanks be to God.

VERSE Romans 6:9; John 16:33b

Alleluia. We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over Him. Alleluia. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world. Alleluia.

HOLY GOSPEL John 15:9-17

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the fifteenth chapter. C: Glory to You, O Lord.

(Obeying Christ's commands and remaining in His love)

⁹If we receive the testimony of men, the testimony of God is greater, for this is the testimony of God that he has borne concerning his Son. ¹⁰Whoever believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself. Whoever does not believe God has made him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that God has borne concerning his Son. ¹¹And this is the testimony, that God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. ¹²Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. ¹³I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God that you may know that you have eternal life. ¹⁴And this is the confidence that we have toward him, that if we ask anything according to his will he hears us. ¹⁵And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests that we have asked of him. ¹⁶If anyone sees his brother committing a sin not leading to death, he shall ask, and God will give him life—to those who commit sins that do not lead to death. There is sin that leads to death; I do not say that one should pray for that. ¹⁷All wrongdoing is sin, but there is sin that does not lead to death.

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord. C: Praise to You, O Christ.

SERMON

"Withholding...No More! 'Let it Go and Let it Go!'"

"Can anyone withhold water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?"

Acts 10:47

CONFESSIONS OF FAITH - CATECHISM (The Third Article)

- P: We learn from our First Reading today that the gift of the Holy Spirit was given to Gentiles as well as to Jews, which includes all the peoples of the world. Let us speak together the words of the Apostles' Creed regarding the Third Person of the Holy Trinity.
- C: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.
- P: What does this mean?
- C: I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true.

P: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and after giving thanks, He broke it and gave it to His disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My † body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also after supper, He took the cup, and after giving thanks He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this is My † blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of all your sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

THE PEACE OF THE LORD

P: The peace of the Lord be with you always. **C: And also, with you.**

HOLY COMMUNION: Starting Sunday, May 9, The Lord's Supper will continue to be offered to the congregation with the communion kits receiving the Lord's supper at your seated location. However, we will now also offer communion at the front of the sanctuary from the Pastor and Elder(s) for those who desire to come forward. Ushers will come to each pew/chair to motion you forward for communion if desiring to take **continuous flow communion**. Pastor and Elder(s) will disinfect/wash hands prior to distribution. Those wanting to come forward for communion will receive the bread (*the Lord's body*) as in the past from the Pastor distributing the bread into your hands. The Elder(s) will have trays of individual cups placed with an open space per cup of wine (*the Lord's blood*). We do ask that per family group or individual to still space 6 feet from each family group or individual as you are ushered forward. [NOTE: Those staying at their seats will commune first with the kits as the Pastor invites you to take the communion elements. Then, if comfortable in receiving communion by coming forward, please remember to lower your mask as you stop to receive into your hands the bread and then to walk to the Elder to take the wine. Thank you. We hope to include kneeling at the altar in the future, but at this time we still ask for your patience as we return gradually to our regular distribution practice. The Lord's blessings upon your communion with our Risen Savior, Jesus.

HOLY COMMUNION is celebrated today. Our belief and practice is Confessional. Jesus clearly teaches He is truly present in His supper in the bread and wine. We receive miraculously, in the gift of faith, His true body and blood, given and shed for the forgiveness of sins. If this is your confession and you have been baptized and confirmed in our church body, please commune with us. If you have questions about communing, please wait to commune until receiving instruction in one of our communion classes. Thank you.
