


our hands. What is truly important? What is worthy of our support? How has God called us to use "unrighteous mammon" for the good of our neighbor and His kingdom?

Ascension Day

The Feast of the Ascension commemorates Jesus' ascension into heaven 40 days after his resurrection. This year it falls on Thursday, May 26th but we will celebrate it on Sunday, May 22.

The observance of this feast is of great antiquity. Eusebius seems to hint at the celebration of it in the 4th century. At the beginning of the 5th century, St. Augustine says



is of Apostolic origin that it may have been celebrated already in 68 AD. Long before Christmas or Easter was celebrated.

What's the big deal about Christ's ascension? Jesus went to heaven. He's gone. We know that. We can't see him. He's left us the Bible, we can talk about him, we can pray to him, and the Holy Spirit is here with us, but Jesus is gone. Isn't he?

That's not what the Bible says, just before Jesus ascended into heaven he said to his disciples, "And lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." Jesus did not ascend into heaven to be absent from us. He ascended into heaven to be present with us. The ascension is the full fruition of the promise of Christ's resurrection being the first-fruits of our own. The ascension means the gospel is better news than we even thought, gooder than good! Because it holds out the promise, the blessed hope, not just of life after death, but "life after life after death." What a gracious God we have!

The Collect Prayer for Ascension Day

Almighty God, whose blessed Son our Savior Jesus Christ ascended far above all heavens, that He might fill all things: Mercifully give us faith to perceive that according to His promise He abides with His Church on earth, even until the end of the world; who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.
