# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### **One More Memorial Celebration**

Recently I was reminded again of the line in the Hymn, "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing" LSB 686 that reads "Here I raise my Ebenezer." (I'm sure most of you are already asking, "What's an Ebenezer? And "Where is Pastor going with this one?") To help you with this, let me share the history behind Samuel's remark.

One of the most catastrophic military losses in Israel's history occurs when the Philistines capture the ark of the covenant at Ebenezer (I Samuel 4:1-11). About twenty years later (and after retrieving the ark), the Israelites engage the Philistines in another significant battle, only this time it is they who prevail (I Samuel 7:7-11). Unlike the first battle, in which the nation acts without consulting God (I Samuel 4:3), they choose to rely on divine intervention (I Samuel 7:8) and are rewarded with an improbable if not miraculous victory. It is a significant triumph as it marks the first time in the nation's history that they defeat the Philistines. Samuel, Israel's last judge, first prophet and de facto leader, commemorates the occasion by setting a monument between Mizpah and Shen, and named it Ebenezer, saying, "Thus far the Lord has helped us." (I Samuel 7:12).

As I'm writing this article, I remember that it was just 3 weeks ago that we remembered Memorial Day which honors those who died fighting in one of America's wars. As I thought about it, I realized that this is far from being the first memorial nor the most significant memorial that was set up. This honor goes to the Memorial established by Jesus Christ Himself to help us remember how He willingly gave up His life so that you and I might have eternal life. As I pondered all of this, it dawned on me that long before

this, God, the creator of the universe, established a weekly memorial of His creative power and ability. Unfortunately, most of mankind pretty much ignores this memorial recorded in Scripture. While it is mentioned many times let these two references suffice:

By the seventh day God had finished the work He had been doing; so on the seventh day he rested from all His work. And <u>God blessed the seventh day and made it holy</u>, because on it he rested from all the work of creating that he had done. (Genesis 2:2-3)

<u>Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy</u>. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. On it you shall not do any work, neither you, nor your son or daughter, nor your manservant or maidservant, nor your animals, nor the alien within your gates. For in six days the Lord made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but he rested on the seventh day. <u>Therefore the Lord blessed</u> <u>the Sabbath day and made it holy</u>. (Exodus 20:8-11)

The Sabbath (seventh day) was given to mankind at the close of creation by God Himself as a memorial of His creative power. God blessed it and made it holy. Later, God reestablished the importance of the Sabbath when He gave us **His** Ten Commandments. The Third Commandment (above) is the only one of the ten that begins with the word **"Remember"** – and yet it is the one commandment of the ten that has all but been forgotten and ignored by most of today's so-called Christians. If God did not intend for us to remember the Sabbath day and to keep it holy, why did He give us the Third Commandment?

Many of today's so-called Christians teach that we now only have Nine Commandments, at least, that's what their lifestyles are teaching their children and the non-Christians who live near them. In doing so, I believe they are gravely in error. You may or may not agree... but I am convinced, now more than ever, that God's Ten Commandments represent His standard of holiness they always have and they always will, at least until heaven and earth disappear (Matthew 5:17-18).

Because of these ten Commandments I have no trouble acknowledging my failure to keep them in the true spiritual intent as Jesus declares them nor the fact that I can only be saved by God's grace through His gift of faith in Jesus (Ephesians 2:8-9). It is impossible for me to be good enough to deserve God's gift of salvation. It is impossible for me to earn God's gift of salvation. I cannot be saved by obeying the Ten Commandments, because it is impossible for me to perfectly obey them. From God's perspective (when He looks at my heart and my mind), I have broken **all** of His Ten Commandments.

Even though I cannot be saved by obeying God's Ten Commandments, I firmly believe I should do my best to obey them - ALL of them. Why? Because, (and let me say this again) they represent God's standard of holiness. Disobeying them would be wrong. If I love God and if I love Jesus, I will obey the commandments that reveal God's will to me. (John 14:15, 1 John 2:3-4 and 1 John 5:1-3).

Now...back to the memorial God has given us... don't get all bent out of shape about what day you or others GO to church. I don't care what day you GO to church and I don't think God cares what day you (or they) GO to church. So, instead of just GOING to church, I encourage you to start **BEING** the church. I realize that **BEING** the church is a new concept to most of today's so-called Christians - but that is exactly what God had in mind when He created the church, and when He gifted His church with the spiritual gifts (Romans 12:6-8; 1 Cor. 12:4 -11, and when the Holy Spirit gifted us in Baptism.

# LCMS STEWARDSHIP MINISTRY - JULY 2024

#### **The Rewards of Godliness**

It's no secret that you can't bribe your way into heaven. No amount of good works will impress God enough to open heaven's door for their sake. "For the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23) and the person who "keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it" (James 2:10). Rather, salvation is "the free gift of God... in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 6:23).

So, your good works won't earn you the reward of heaven. But does that mean that there are no rewards at all? Consider what the Small Catechism says in the "Close of the Commandments":

What does God say about all these commandments? He says, "I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." (Ex. 20:5–6)

What does this mean? God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands. (SC II)

God promises to bless you in keeping His commandments. What might these blessings be?

Well, consider what Paul says about keeping the Fourth Commandment: "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother' (this is the first commandment with a promise), 'that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land'" (Eph. 6:1–3).

And think about what your life would be like if you went around stealing (breaking the Seventh Commandment), telling lies about people (breaking the Eighth Commandment), and generally being cruel to those around you (breaking all the commandments!). That is obviously not a blessed way to live. In fact, you'd be miserable living that way.

And Jesus says more about what is in store for those who make sacrifices for His sake: "Jesus said to them, 'Truly, I say to you, in the new world, when the Son of Man will sit on His glorious throne, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands, for My name's sake, will receive a hundredfold and will inherit eternal life'" (Matt. 19:28– 29).

So don't grow impatient in doing good. Follow the Lord who has freely given you everlasting life.





## SUNDAY ADULT BIBLE STUDY

The Sunday Bible study will be paused until after Labor Day as our Vacancy Pastor will be almost more vacant than here. Of the nine



Sundays in July and August he will be vacant for four of the Sundays. On September 8th we will begin a new study on understanding the creeds we confess. While the Apostles Creed may be easy to understand (though there are some questions) The Nicene Creed and the Athanasian Creeds have phrases that are much more challenging.

#### Four Ways to Encourage Your Kids to Leave the Church

I'm never for doing anything halfway. So if you want your kids to leave the church when they leave your home, I've got a list for you. Here are four ways that you can contribute to your child's spiritual demise:



- Make other things a priority over church assemblies and functions. Be sure that you are giving your child the impression that there are some things that are more important than assembling with the church if they are "big" enough. Be sure the church comes second to some things. These things include (but are not limited to) sporting events, vacations, family get-togethers, and even some forms of working. Only doing this occasionally is sufficient to get the point across to your child. Better yet, cut out Bible class entirely and only come for Sunday morning worship.
- 2. Don't talk about God, Jesus, or the church when you are at home or in the car. Keep your lips sealed when it comes to spiritual matters. Don't ask, and don't tell.
- 3. When you do talk, be sure to complain and nitpick as much as possible. Complain about the preacher, his sermons, the elders, the deacons, the singing, the song selection, the Bible class, the Bible class teacher, the Bible class materials, young kids, older people, and any other Christian who is different from yourself. Never give your child the impression that you are appreciative of the church, or that you respect those who serve it. Never be satisfied. Be sure to plant the seed of dissatisfaction in your child's mind.
- 4. Indulge your child's immaturity. Despite the fact that they have yet to develop a real concept of the value of a dollar, give them full control when it comes to their most valuable asset: their soul. Even though they might want to eat pizza and french fries for every meal, let them make every soul-affecting decision for themselves. If they don't want to do "it," don't make them do "it." This applies to all aspects of participation, including Bible class, worship, and even (for the boys) leading worship. Make attendance optional. For that matter, make everything optional, with no consequences.

Of course no Christian parent really wants to drive their child away from God and the church. But sometimes we do things that might inadvertently do just that. I'm not saying that if you ever do one of the previous four things I mentioned that your kids are destined for Hell's fire. But what I am saying is that if you can catch yourself before you keep up some of those pitfalls then you will have a far better time helping your children to transition from being preteens, to being spiritually minded teenagers, and then to being faithful Christian adults.

Consider the statement made in Psalm 127:4: "Like arrows in the hand of a warrior, so are the children of one's youth." Just as arrows need to be aimed well in order to have a chance of hitting their target, our children need to be "aimed" well in order for them to have a chance of "hitting the target" of righteous and faithful living, and ultimately Heaven. Even though the possibility exists that you won't hit the "target" with your "arrows," you definitely won't get anywhere near the target if you aren't at least taking careful aim at it. You have to at least try! Here are a few things to consider when it comes to making that aim:

- Matthew 6:33 Be sure that the kingdom (the church) is really the first priority in your family life. Don't let other things become diversions that take you and your kids away from the church. Even missing or failing to participate a few times can set a precedent in your child's mind that's hard to change. You get bonus points if you take or encourage your children to go to Gospel meetings, singings, Summer Youth Series, Bible camp, and other such things.
- Deuteronomy 6:6-7 Teach your children at every opportunity. A nature walk can become a discussion about Genesis. A ride home from baseball practice can become a lesson about always doing your best (cf. Ecc. 9:10). Mealtime can become Bible time. Take those opportunities to teach, as they are all around you.
- 3. Proverbs 22:6 The word "train" in this verse means more than just talking to your kids about God. It literally means "to narrow," and also is translated as "dedicate" in other places besides this passage. Think about dedicating your child's path to the Lord, as well as "reining in" their immaturity. That's what it really means to train - to narrow the focus of your child's life to not just what they should do, but what they ought to do. There is a difference.

This is by no means an exhaustive list, But I pray that you will take these words, and do some studying and praying on your own. "Step up like a warrior, and aim those arrows to Heaven." You see, the reality is that there is one person who has more to do with a child's direction in life than any preacher, elder, youth minister, teacher, or coach: It's you, their parent. Step up like a warrior, and aim those arrows to Heaven.
